## **Structure:**

The nomenclature consists of 6 main groups, which are further divided by relevant aspects of the given group. There are 13 subgroups at the second level and 21 groups at the third level. Major group 6 contains workers not classifiable by status.

## **Short description:**

The FVO'99 classifies currently or previously employed persons according to the freedom of decision and the economic risk taken in connection with working. The two strikingly different categories are persons who have paid employment jobs and persons who are self-employed. The actual main groups have the main characteristics of the basic categories. The classification contains the deepest (and generally used) levels, but even then it can be taken only as a framework that can be extended for the need of the specific surveys or be used only at a higher aggregated level. The Hungarian Classification of Status in Employment is structured according to the principles of the international classification (ICSE-93), but it also takes into account the grouping aspects of the previous domestic classifications.

**Linked classifications:** The Hungarian version of the classification follows the principles of the international nomenclature (ICSE'93) and is compatible with it.
