

# ITO

**Full title:** Classification of Industrial Products

**Implementation date:** 1st January 2008

**History of the classification:**

The predecessor of ITO was the Domestic Product Classification (BTO) based on NACE Rev. 1.1 (TEÁOR'03), which was in effect until 31 December 2007.

ITO has been in effect since 1 January 2008, it was drawn up on the basis of NACE, CPA and the PRODCOM List. ITO is annually revised according to the changes in the PRODCOM List. From 1 January 2016 the basis of ITO at 6 digits level was CPA'15.

**Structure:**

The structure of the 12-digit codes:

- 1-4th digits identical with the Statistical Classification of Economic Activities in the European Community (NACE Rev. 2.1.)
- 1-6th digits identical with the Classification of Products by Activity (CPA Ver. 2.2.)
- 1-8th digits corresponding to PRODCOM, in case of “HU” item codes are formed by HCSO
- 9th digit is a possibility for further demolition in case of “HU” item codes, if 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> digits are reserved for PRODCOM codes
- 10-12th digits indicate the unit of measurement

**Short description:**

The Hungarian Classification of Industrial Products (ITO) is a hierarchical classification containing products and services. ITO is the domestic version of PRODCOM list issued by Eurostat. ITO is used for observing industrial products and services.

**Field of application:**

The „Annual statistical survey of production” (1039 OSAP) monitors the production and sales – in volume and value – of industrial products and services according to the ITO classification.

**Relationship with international classifications:**

The ITO classification bases on the PRODCOM list of industrial products published by Eurostat.
